The meeting of the Volunteer Firemen's Association of Cambria County and Vicinity was hosted by the Dauntless Volunteer Fire Company, February 28, 2019 with the President Christopher Cox presiding.

President Cox called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m.

President Cox extended on the behave of the memberships a thank you for the meal that the members of Dauntless Fire Company served before the meeting.

President Cox Introduced visiting members of DCNR. District Forester Bob Wetzel gave a presentation regarding many things for fire companies to become prepared for with the upcoming fire session on the horizon. Mr. Wetzel spoke on the thoughts of local fire companies using the aircraft that will be supplied by the local forestry department. Also spoke on the upcoming classes that will be given to local fire companies on wildland firefighting including the S-130 class that will be giving at our fire academy spring weekends. Another member had introduced herself and spoke on the issues regarding arson awareness on the forest fires we may run into. She had mentioned to the group if the chief officers believe it maybe arson to let the district forester know so that the arson team can start on everything immediately. Mr. Wetzel also remined the local fire companies when the DCNR grant period would open and the amounts that fire companies could apply for now. He finished up with reminding the local wardens and fire chiefs know when the forestry banquet would be held and when it would be held.

At this time Ed Cochran of Clymer Volunteer Fire Company presented President Cox with a Gavel and Block that he had made for the association. President Cox accepted this gift and ask the membership to thank Mr. Cochran for this gift.

Motion by Mark Coleman of Beaverdale to pay the monthly bills, with a proper 2<sup>nd</sup> by George Popson of Patton motion was carried.

**Treasurer Report:** Treasurer Paul Kundrod read the Treasurer Report. With a copy on file with the Secretary. Motion by Larry Penatzer of Summerhill Boro. to accept the Treasurer's report as read, and with a proper 2<sup>nd</sup> by Bruce Moriconi of Hope. Motion was carried.

#### **Committee Reports:**

**Law & Legislative:** Steve Unger of Conemaugh reported that the members of the house and senate have only meet a few times since the beginning of the year. He also reported that the recommendation for SR6 have been sent to committee to be reviewed.

**Fire School:** Bill Cornell of West Hills reported that the fire school sign up cutoff date will be March 10<sup>th</sup>. The next fire school meeting will be at the fire academy on March 18<sup>th</sup>. 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President and Training officer Jim McCann of Johnstown reported that there is a total of five essential classes taking place at this time, also there will be four of the module four with live burn running after module three has finished up. March 23<sup>rd</sup> will be a makeup date for the CPR class that had been canceled.

**Fire School Site:** John Hawksworth of Dauntless reported still need more bricks sold for the completion of the walls. There will be a dedication service at the fire academy on Sunday of the first weekend of fire school. The dedication will be conducted at noon that day. This will be a dedication for the wall and the flag pole that had been put in place as an Eagle scout project.

**Certification:** Eric Miller of Johnstown reported that dates listed on the web site of the upcoming FF I and other Certification classes that will be conducted in the next few months. He also reported that a certification workshop will be held at the Dauntless Fire Company.

**Web Site:** William Cornell of West Hills reported that everything he has is on the site. He needs the December meeting minutes from the secretary as soon as he receives them he will see that they are put up under the documents.

**Historical:** Nick Wuckovich of Conemaugh reported that he inquired about reprinting the historical book. If we would wish to have it reprinted that if we would order one hundred books or more the price per book would be thirty dollars (\$30.00). Ed Hudak of Beaverdale made a Motion to give Nick permission to move forward with having one hundred more historical books printed and to sell them for thirty dollars each, properly 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mark Coleman of Beaverdale. Motion Carried.

**911 EMA:** Robbin Melnyk 911 Coordinator reported on the radio project, she mentioned that they are very close to finalizing a deal on the radio project. Once this has been finalized and released the vendors will have six months to a year to place bids on the steps in the project. They have received money for a fiber path with Somerset County. The unused money from this project will be used at tower sites. There has been a new 180' tower set in the Cresson area. This tower is being selected with the new radio updates. Robbin was also proud to announce that with the quality and assurance that the dispatch center has shown, PEMA will be using Cambria County methods to other outlying counties to look at to meet better quality and assurance in their areas.

Art Martynuska the EMA coordinator mentioned that the Sharp team had conducted training last evening. The members of this team will be receiving all the updates that they need to move forward. They are looking to get the LACP building insulated and better equipped for the team. He reported that Region 13 has moved form its present location to the Pittsburgh Airport for better service and more room. He is asking for help from the county fire departments to help promote stickers to be placed on firefighter's helmets that would show the level of training everyone is updated to. This would help the team at incidents to be able to utilize the qualified personal in the field in which they would be qualified up to. Art has also offered to meet with any fire department that may want to meet one on one with him or he could possibly even attend fire department meetings if ask.

**Fire Advisory Board:** Steve Verbosky of Colver reported that the next advisory board meeting will be held on Tuesday March 26, 2019.

**Resolutions:** Chaplin Drew Walters read the resolutions of past Member Robert Rematt from Carrolltown Volunteer Fire Company, Station "51" all members in attendance stood in one minute of total silence for our departed members.

**County Convention:** Darrin Smith 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President mentioned that the convention will be held the week of July 27<sup>th</sup> through August 3, 2019. He also mention to fire companies that are interested in placing a bid on the grand champion trophy that the Chernisky 5k 10k race and walk will be held July 6<sup>th</sup> and fire companies that compete in turnout gear will be awarded points to this trophy, he also mention that there is now a fire prevention book that can be submitted to the secretary no later than the June meeting, and that fire companies that attended our springs fire school can be awarded points to the grand champion trophy as well.

Ed Hudak from Beaverdale made mention that he will buy each person that donates one pint of blood a pint of their favorite adult beverage. It was also made mention that Past President Bernie Blaszosky would donate the 84<sup>th</sup> pint if it had made it to that number.

**Good of the Order:** John Hawksworth of Dauntless presented a news letter that had been printed back in the year 1991 by our Association. He made mention that he and some other members would like to see something like this started back up to show case our Association.

A rising vote of thanks was called for by Richie Brown Jr. of Nanty Glo Fire Company for hosting and providing the members in attendance with a meal.
