Cambria County Regional Firefighter's Association Law & Legislative Committee Report December 10,2020

The bills have been introduced and are assigned tocommittees are alive and must be acted upon by both House and the Senate by December 31,2020, the end of current 2019-2020 session. If no action is taken they become dead and must be reintroduced in the new session.

Act 91HB 1673 Printers # 4573 Signed by Governor on 10/29/2020

- 1. Changed the Name of the Volunteer Loan Assistance Program to the Fire and Emergency Services Loan Fund. Loans will be administered by the State Fire Commsitioner The Loan Amounts were increased app. 10% and repayment period increased. A ballot referendum scheduled next spring to allow loans to career fire and EMS companies. Also loan amounts are review every 2 years and based upon CPI Inflation Index
- 2. Office of State Fire Commissioner moved out of PEMA and reports directly to the Governor. The person will chair the State Fire Advisory Board; administer the State Fire Academy; administer Grant and Loan Programs; Develop curriculum certification; and other programs for the Fire Service and General Public.
 - 3. Reorganize the Fire Advisory Board in its makeup and responsibilities.
- 4. Added Combination Relief Association Career and Volunteer; Moves certification and distribution of Relief Funds from Auditor General's Office to Fire Commissioner; Auditing still done by Auditor General's Office; Expanded use of Relief Funds to include recruitment and retention; Length of Service Program; Stipends to Volunteer Firefighters not to exceed \$1500 annually.
- 5. Extended Grant Program for 4 years until June 30,2024; ,Establishes Construction Savings Account for construction for up to five years on new structures
- 6. Expanded First Responders Tax Credit to all Municipalities regardless of size. Tax Credit on Income tax and real property tax not to exceed 100%

Act 108 SB 94 Printers # 2101 Signed by Governor November 3,2020

1. Amends Worksmans Compensation Act to expand coverage to First Responders Old Law only covered firefighters injured in actual firefighting duties. Special (Fire) Police are Fully covered. Officers and members doing any activity in order to provide necessary operational support. This means: maintaining station or fire equipment; fund raisers providing IT support; Assitsting in recruitment; fire prevention programs and any administrating tasks.

NOTE; ACTIVITES ARE TO BE DONE ON A REGULAR BASIS AND APPROVED BY THE MUNICIPALITY THAT PURCHASES THE WORKSMAN'S COMPENSATION INSURANCE.

Act 118 HB777 Printers # 4342 Signed by Governor November 25,2020

Permits Club Licenses to utilize the 60% Amount originally to be sent to a non-profit to Cover operating expenses during the Pandemic Period beginning with the 2020 calendar Year through the period of one year after the termination of the proclamation of disaster Emergency issued March 6,2020
