2022-2023 was not as busy compared to our previous years for the Certification Committee and staff. We conducted five (5) tests over the past fiscal year from July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023.

The break down in each discipline is as follows:

- 56 Fire Fighter I (last candidate # 1676)
- 32 Fire Fighter II (last candidate # 470)
- 0 Haz-Mat Awareness (last candidate # 212)
- 0 Haz-Mat Operations (last candidate # 154)
- 0 Pumper Driver Operator (last candidate # 010)

On November 3, 2022; committee members Eric Miller, Bill Cornell, John Hawksworth and Paul Kundrod attended the mandatory Test Site Certification meeting at the PA State Fire Academy in Lewistown, PA.

The 2023 annual evaluator's workshop was conducted online via using the PA Train website.

The following tests are scheduled for the remainder of the year:

1. Firefighter I - Closed Test Alexandria VFC (Huntingdon County): Sept. 29 & 30, 2023
2. Firefighter II - Open Test: October 7, 2023
3. Firefighter I - Open Test: October 20 & 21, 2023
4. Firefighter II - Closed Test Friendship VFC (Roaring Spring, Blair County): Oct. 28, 2023
5. Firefighter I - Closed Test Morris Twp. VFC (Clearfield County): Nov. 3 & 4, 2023

Note: Southern Cove VFC (Bedford County) expressed interest in doing a Closed FF-1 test.

The 2023 Test Site Coordinators and Pro-Board meetings will be held on November 2, 2023 in Lewistown. The financial report was submitted to the Audit Committee.

Fire Training Report

The Cambria County Regional Firefighters Association sponsored 5 Essential Programs. These programs started in January and continued through May. These programs were a huge success and put training Firefighters on the street throughout Cambria, Indiana, Blair, Clearfield, Somerset, Huntington, and Allegheny Counties.

The "Leadership Academy" was offered again this year. It was comprised of 12 individual programs all done via zoom. 180 Students took advantage of these programs with more than 2000 certificates issued. Bucks County Community College was key in supporting these programs.

We also provided two programs to assist Association Departments with marketing training. Facebook Training and Public Relations classes were offered and were well attended.

The annual County Fire School was held this year. Classes were held over three weekends in April. All classes were held either at the Cambria Heights High School or the Fire School Site.

The Training Committee along with the Site Committee worked together again this year to open the Fire School Site in the evenings, during the week, for department training.

Bucks County Community College provided free Firefighter 1 and Hazardous Materials Operations Level Certification to students who completed Interior Firefighter as part of the Essentials Program. Several students took advantage of this certification.

A special thanks to the Training Committee, the Site Committee, the Officer of the Association, Cambria County Commissioners and all the others who continue to support training in Cambria County.

Site Committee Report for 2022/2023

- We instituted a parking policy for the site. We did this in an effort to prevent damage to the grassy areas and cut down the need for repairs.
- We had the burn buildings inspected. Both the concrete building and the metal buildings are in good shape, but we may only burn in the metal containers. There are some minor repairs that need to be done to the concrete building. Next inspection will be in 2026.
- We had an assessment of the pond done. The pond is in good shape.
- We acquired an engine from Alum Bank Fire Company in March of 2023. So far the engine is working great.
- We did a major clean-up of the site this year. We got rid of all of the junk laying around.
- We repaired the roof cut simulator and repaired the glass breaking station.

- We ran power to the rehab trailer.
- We sold the Riverside and the Reade Township engines this past May.
- In June, we had the pile of millings spread on the upper road from the main road to the burn building area. We plan on doing the final piece of roadway in August.
- Thanks to ServePro for their water donations and to Tom Cherninsky for hosting the run that benefits the fire school.



The certification is whereas a candidate tests to a national level and is done with a written and physical test. Evaluators are paid according to a testing and fee schedule at our site. Our association is made up of fire departments in a 6 county region- having over 65 departments and over 1200 individual delegate members. All fire school and testing expenses are categorized in this expense category. Also included are site maintenance, grass cutting, and fuel for site vehicles, associated to the program.
